Describe the rationale for the proposed program change(s):

Our purpose for a name change is to adopt a name that more accurately describes the diverse composition of our faculty and academic programs. It is not our intention or plan to encroach on the well-defined disciplinary areas of any other department on campus. In the event of future academic program changes, we intend to inform our colleagues in other departments (e.g., Economics and Mathematics) that may be potentially affected by such changes.

Past Actions:

The faculty and staff of the Department of Food and Resource Economics have had a series of discussions about the need for a name change. On October 10, 2011, the faculty voted overwhelmingly (**Yes - 17**; **No - 0**, **Abstain - 1**) in support of changing the department's name.

Rationale and Justification:

There are several compelling reasons why the department should now be named "Department of Applied Economics and Statistics":

- 1. The Statistics Program moved from the Department of Mathematical Sciences to the Department of Food and Resource Economics in 2000, yet the name of the department was never changed to reflect this change.
- 2. Our faculty composition and emphasis is not accurately reflected in the department's current name. While faculty members continue to work on economic research related to food systems and natural resources, much of the research in the department is in applying the techniques and theory of economics to other areas. Therefore the name of "applied economics" will be more inclusive.
- 3. In our sub-field, "Applied Economics" is often used to describe teaching, research, and outreach programs that focus on these three areas of agricultural and food systems: agribusiness management & marketing; environmental & resource economics, agricultural development & trade.
- 4. The name change will better position our department in the recruitment of undergraduate and graduate students nationally and internationally. It will also draw more attention to the innovative and multidisciplinary research conducted by our faculty.
- 5. The name of our national association was recently changed from "American Agricultural Economics Association" to "Agricultural and Applied Economics Association".
- 6. The national trend in our subfield is to change department names to include the words "Applied Economics" in the title of many programs. Departments that have made this change include the following:

Consultation with Related Departments:

Dr. Titus Awokuse, the chair of the Department of Food and Resource Economics consulted with Dr. Saul Hoffman, the chair of the Department of Economics and participated in an Economics Dept. faculty meeting to discuss the name change. After an opportunity to clearly define and clarify our rationale for name change and exploring possible ramifications of the new department name for both our departments, they expressed no objections to moving forward with our plans.

In addition, Dr. Titus Awokuse also consulted with the Dr. John Pelesko, chair of the Department of Mathematical Sciences regarding the department name change and solicited their input and support. After consulting with his faculty, John Pelesko provided a letter of support that strongly endorsed the proposed name change.

The proposed name change will not affect the name of our academic majors, which are quite well differentiated from the majors offered by UD's Department of Economics' undergraduate and graduate degrees. For example, we will continue to have the following majors:

- Food and Agribusiness Marketing and Management
- Natural Resource Management
- Environmental and Resource Economics (previously Resource Economics)
- Agricultural Education
- Statistics

We have worked well in the past in partnership with other departments at the University of Delaware and hope to continue on this path. In addition to some teaching and research collaborations other departments, we also have several joint faculty appointments and cross-listed courses between our departments.
