The Executive Committee of the Winterthur Program in Early American Culture met on October 27, 2006, to respond to the Academic Peer Review conducted in 2005. One of the recommendations of the APR was the elimination of the word "Early" from the Program title as students have pursued research interests across the full spectrum of American history for more than 25 years. The new title, Winterthur Program in American Material Culture, more accurately reflects the Program's course of study and signals that the Program's faculty and students are interested in more than topics associated with "early" American culture. The Executive Committee unanimously approved the change after consulting with alumni and the administration of the Winterthur Museum.
