#### **Proposed Distribution Requirements:**

Students enrolled in the <u>M.A. Program</u> and <u>Direct Ph.D. Program</u> must take at least one graduate-level course (600 or 800 level) in each of the following four time periods:

Before the year 1400 / 1400 -1700 / 1700 - 1900 / 1900 - present

## AND

at least one graduate-level course in three of the following five areas:

European / Art of the Americas / African / East Asian / Art of Islam

N.B. A single course may fulfill both a chronological and a geographical area distribution requirement.

Students who enter the <u>Ph.D. Program with an M.A. in Art History (from another institution</u>) must take at least one graduate-level course (600 or 800 level) in three of the following four time periods:

Before the year 1400 /1400 -1700 / 1700 - 1900 / 1900 - present

### AND

at least one graduate-level course in three of the following five areas:

European / Art of the Americas / African / East Asian / Art of Islam

N.B. A single course may fulfill both a chronological and a geographical area distribution requirement.

### **Current Distribution Requirements:**

### M.A. distribution requirements:

Each student must take at least one graduate-level (600 or 800) course in five out of the six areas that follow:

Ancient / Medieval and/or Northern Renaissance / Italian Renaissance / 17th and/or 18th Century / Modern (includes American art post-1945) / American

#### Ph.D. distribution requirements:

Six credits are to be in an area or areas of art history outside of the major and minor fields of concentration.
