The minor in Dance is a joint effort between the College of Arts and Sciences and the College of Health Sciences, utilizing faculty from the Department of Theatre and faculty from the Department of Health, Nutrition, and Exercise Science. Supporting documentation from units is attached.

Describe the rationale for the proposed program change(s):

The University of Delaware includes visual art, music, and theatre major and minor programs of study for undergraduate and graduate students. Although dance is a popular choice of UD student organizations (7 dance related clubs exist on the campus), there are few courses and no degree programs available. In a recent survey of 110 current students who have an interest in dance, 55% responded to the survey with all 55% stating that if there was a dance minor available, they would matriculate into the program. These students represent majors from across the university's colleges. The Admissions Office confirms that inquiries about dance at UD are numerous, and students are often disappointed to learn they have no option for curricular study of dance on campus. With enrollment data available from 1995 to the present, the one dance course that has been offered at UD during this period has averaged 18 students where the enrollment limit (due to the size of the dance studio) was 20. This fall 2008, a Dance Composition course is being offered experimentally, and it filled to capacity (20 students) at first registration last spring. Its roster includes student representation from the following Colleges: Arts and Sciences; Human Services, Education and Public Policy; Agriculture and Natural Resources; Health Sciences; Business and Economics; and Undergraduate Studies. Due to its demand, another section will be offered during winter session 2009.

The purpose of the proposed dance minor is to provide students with a comprehensive dance education that will include opportunities for them to perform, choreograph, conduct research, and teach in school and community settings. The course work is flexible and adaptive for a large range of students. A unique aspect of this program is a required capstone course that is interdisciplinary. The student is required to combine the dance interest with content from the major course of study. This capstone could be utilized as an honors senior thesis for qualified students.

The minor in Dance will provide students with the opportunity to study a variety of coursework including, but not limited to, technique, composition and choreography, and elective choices in the historical, cultural, pedagogical, and somatic areas of dance. Additionally, dance minors will complete a variable credit capstone experience project.
