

BUDGET MODEL FOR "HYBRID" ONLINE/IN-CLASS M.A. IN SOCIAL STUDIES IN WORLD HISTORY PROGRAM					
Assumes a cohort Master's program of 30 credits spread across 2 years. One cohort admitted per year.					
Each cohort takes 10 3-cr courses as follows: 2 Second Summer; 1 Fall; 1 Spr; 2 Sec Sum; 1 Fall; 1 Spr; 2 Sec Sum)					
Because each course would not be open enrollment, and the courses would use a blended delivery format, the budget uses S-contact teaching rates. Full and associate professor regular faculty and assistant professor supplemental faculty would be used. The computation uses a 3-cr S-contract rate of \$6,975 (or \$2,325 per cr taught).
