### Describe the rationale for the proposed program change(s):

- 1. We propose to delete "American" from the name of the minor. This change brings us up to date with current practice. While we'll still address the American context, new hires in the faculty who have broader interests in material culture as well a greater international focus throughout the university encourage us to eliminate the restriction to "American." Since the Center itself has dropped "American" from its name, changing the name of the minor follows logically.
- 2. Internships are an important element of the minor, supported by special funding from donors Peter and Susan Finkel and an excellent tool for career preparation. But we'd like to remove the internship as a requirement, a change that reflects the need to send only well prepared students into cultural institutions in the field. All qualified minors will receive internships. In addition, since the minor internship should represent experience outside a student's major, students cannot substitute a major course for it, and thus we propose to strike the statement in the catalog that "Approved students with written permission may substitute ART 408." For those students who do not pursue an internship we will offer the option of independent study.

The Center for Material Culture Studies offers an interdisciplinary undergraduate minor that engages students in understanding the diversity of cultures through the things and places people create. Courses in the minor help students gain new perspective on objects and sites, from the intimate environments of the home to the historical development of regional landscapes. The minor draws on the University's rich on-campus resources in material culture studies, including the University Museums, the Paul R. Jones Collection, the Center for Historic Architecture and Design, and the Museum Studies Program, and its long-standing affiliations with such outstanding cultural institutions in the region as the Winterthur Museum & Country Estate and the Hagley Museum and Library. Students in the minor are encouraged but not required to complete an internship that would enhance their exposure to behind-the-scenes work in cultural institutions such as museums, historical societies, and historic preservation agencies.

In addition, since the minor internship should represent experience outside a student's major, students cannot substitute a major course for it, and thus we propose to strike the statement in the catalog that "Approved students with written permission may substitute ART 408."


