Current requirements are considered unviable as there are not enough honors courses across the different political science subfields and concentrations. The current situation places undue burden on staff who must make individual exceptions. This change does not change the integrity of the major/concentration or the honors components. In the case of POSC without concentration, changes loosen only the specific requirement that POSC honors courses come from different subfields. For example, students still must take courses across political science fields for the Political Science major without concentration. In the case of POSC with concentration, changes loosen only requirement that students take at least two honors courses from their concentration.
