Change to Minor Requirements: Students will take courses in two of four fields instead of two of five fields.

We are proposing to eliminate the concentration in Public Policy and Public Administration. The School of Urban Affairs and Public Policy has established a new undergraduate major and minors in Public Policy and in Public Administration which obviates the need for a concentration in political science. We will remain committed to the four traditional subfields of political science: American government, comparative government, international relations and political theory. This change will not affect a large number of students as only a small number of our majors choose to concentrate in Public Policy and Public Administration (about 2%).

Program Requirements:

A minor in political science must complete 15 credits of work in the Department of Political Science and International Relations. The following requirements must be met:

- (1) POSC 150 (American Political System) with minimum grade of "C-"
- (2) One course at the 200 level or higher any field
- (3) Three Upper Division Courses: Minors must take 2 courses at the 400 level and 1 additional course at the 300 or 400 level. Course selections should be made in light of the next requirement (4) below.
- (4) Distribution Requirement: The 3 upper division courses noted above must be taken in 2 of the 4 fields within political science as described in the remainder of this handout. The fields are American Government and Politics, Comparative Government and Politics, International Relations, and Political Theory.
