The BS in Psychology is approved and running. Many of the students are in the Honors Program, and we need create an Honors degree program. We propose these requirements for the Honors BS in Psychology degree:

The recipient must complete:

- 1. All requirements for the Bachelor of Science degree with a major in Psychology.
- 2. All of the University's generic requirements for the Honors Baccalaureate degree.
- 3. Twelve credits of honors courses in Psychology. At least six credits must be at the 300 level or higher.

The requirements are similar to those of many other Honors programs in Arts and Sciences.

We want this proposal to be <u>effective immediately</u> so that it pertains to students who will graduate in the 2010 Spring semester.
