List new courses required for the new or revised curriculum. How do they support the overall program objectives of the major/minor/concentrations)?

BAMS 352: Black Feminist Theory; EDUC 459: Urban Schools and Urban Landscapes Courses currently being submitted to Faculty Senate. They provide electives for the "development within diverse communities" component of the minor. Including these courses from other units enhances the breadth and interdisciplinary nature of the minor.

The minor addresses goal 4 (Engage questions of ethics and recognize responsibilities to self, community, and society at large). The minor, by the nature of the courses, addresses the application of human development and family research to significant social problems. Students are encouraged to enter into dialogue about these issues and consider ethical dilemmas that arise.

The minor addresses goal 5 (Understand the diverse ways of thinking that underlie the search for knowledge in the arts, humanities, sciences and social sciences). The minor reflects an interdisciplinary understanding of human development and family studies. It builds upon an HDFS faculty as well as includes courses from different departments, such as Sociology, Black American Studies, Women's Studies, and the School of Education.

The minor also addresses goal 9 (Understand the foundations of United States society including the significance of its cultural diversity). The field of Human Development and Family Studies focuses on the ways that individuals, families, and their communities interact. Courses in the minor emphasize how race and ethnicity, social class, gender, and ability and disability impact human development across the lifespan. Courses also focus on diverse families and the complex interactions between families and communities.

The minor further addresses goal 10 (International perspective). The HDFS minor addresses issues of human development and family studies cross culturally as well as within the United States.

Describe the rationale for the proposed program change(s):

A minor in Human Development and Family Studies will provide students across campus with the chance to integrate contemporary applied human development and family studies concerns in our society with the primary focus of their majors. The minor provides coursework on how people interact with and are affected by their families, communities, and society from infancy through old age, throughout the US and globally. The focus of courses also includes intervention and social policy implications that cut across disciplines, providing an interdisciplinary perspective and opportunities for students to bring their learnings from their own majors to discussions during minor coursework. While continuing to focus on their major field of interest, students with a minor in HDFS will gain additional knowledge and skills in working with children, families, and adults from diverse backgrounds across a variety of settings. The minor will provide a broad range of students across the University campus the opportunity to engage with issues in human development and families, and see how their primary focus of study may be applied to contemporary human development and family issues in our society. Also, students who discover this field late in their undergraduate career will now have a formal degree option, i.e. the HDFS minor. Additionally, the new minor will strengthen the connections between the Department of Human Development and Family Studies and the other units teaching courses for the minor.
