Requiring all students to take HDFS 470: Families and Children at Risk will also enhance students' abilities to work and learn both independently and collaboratively (Goal #4) since the course requires both individual and group work, and emphasizes the interdependent nature of different community services and policies.

### **Describe the rationale for the proposed program change(s):**

HDFS 470: Families and Children at Risk will be will be *required* for all students in the concentration, rather than as an option for meeting a requirement. This class covers a broad range of topics and issues critical to family and consumer sciences teachers. Requiring this course within this concentration will also increase the consistency in requirements across the concentrations and majors within the department. Dropping HDFS 270: Families and Developmental Disabilities as an option for meeting this requirement will not limit students, as disability-related issues are covered in HDFS 470, as well as in other required courses, such as HDFS 235: Survey in Child and Family Services and EDUC 414: Teaching Exceptional Adolescents.
