No new courses will be required for the revised curriculum. However, one new course will be an option to meet requirements in the curriculum. WOMS408/HDFS408: Domestic Violence Policy and Prevention will be an option to meet the risk elective. Please see below for justification.

The addition of classes as options to meet the current requirements will enhance students’ ability to think critically and solve problems (Goal #2) in a wider variety of topic areas. These classes will also help students to attain skills in oral and written communication and the use of information technology (Goal #1). Requiring all students to take HDFS 470: Families and Children at Risk will also enhance students’ abilities to work and learn both independently and collaboratively (Goal #4) since the course requires both individual and group work, and emphasizes the interdependent nature of different community services.

HDFS 408: Domestic Violence Policy and Prevention is cross-listed with WOMS 408. Permission to add this course as one of the options for the “Individuals and Families at Risk” elective from Jessica Schiffman, Associate Chair of Women’s Studies, is attached.

Describe the rationale for the proposed program change(s):

1. HDFS 475: Topics in Human Development and Family Studies or HDFS 472: Substance Abuse and the Family is being dropped as a requirement. HDFS 472 will be added as an option for the risk elective (see below). While current topics are critically important for students, cutting edge topics are already integrated across the existing curriculum. Moreover, since the department added Topics in Human Development and Family Studies as a requirement, several new specialty courses have also developed (including HDFS 472: Substance Abuse and the Family and HDFS 403: Adult Disability Issues), thus reducing the need for a Topics course.
2. The addition of HDFS 472: Substance Abuse and the Family and HDFS/WOMS 408: Domestic Violence Policy and Practice as options for meeting the Individuals and Families at Risk elective will broaden the available options for students interested in these issues. In addition, given the rates of both substance abuse and of violence in families, these two courses will each provide students with important information in providing services and developing policies across a variety of fields.
3. HDFS 470: Families and Children at Risk will be dropped as an option for the Individuals and Families at Risk elective and instead will be required for all students. This class covers a broad range of topics and issues critical to providing appropriate services in the community for children and their families. Requiring this course within this concentration will also increase the consistency in requirements across the concentrations and majors within the department.
