This Faculty Senate Document is requesting the addition of a concentration in Agriculture Education to the Master of Instruction degree. In addition to the 12 credits of required core coursework for the major and the required 3 credits of Portfolio coursework, the concentration will contain 18 credits of coursework from the departments of Agriculture Education, Food and Resource Education, and Statistics. The only new course is one that has been previously offered as an experimental course, AGED 667, Working With Advisory Councils. The new, permanent number for this course will be AGED 630. This concentration has been developed with the collaboration of our colleagues in Agriculture Education.

The College of Agriculture and Natural Resources already has a Master of Arts (M.A.) in Agricultural and Technology Education. This degree program is designed to be an initial certification program for individuals who are seeking certification to be an Agriculture Education teacher. However, there is no current masters program that is specifically tailored to meet the needs of current Agriculture Education teachers. The Master of Instruction program is intentionally designed to serve the needs of current PK-12 teachers, and this concentration will be tailored to Delaware teachers of Agriculture Education and Cooperative Extension teachers.

The concentration in Agriculture Education has been developed at the request of and with close collaboration from our colleagues in Agriculture Education.

Describe the rationale for the proposed program change(s):

We are seeking to add a new concentration – Agriculture Education – to the Master of Instruction degree at the request and collaboration of the Department of Agricultural Education. Currently, there is no existing masters program that is appropriate for K-12 Agriculture Education teachers. By combining our Education core courses with concentration courses in AGED, FREC, and STAT, this will provide a viable option for Agriculture Education teachers who are interested in improving their practice and/or preparing for National Board Certification.
