Describe the rationale for the proposed program change(s):

Two years ago the School Psychology Program successfully petitioned the faculty senate to establish an Education Specialist (Ed.S.) degree. Prior to the approval of this new degree, school psychology students completed 30 credits and earned an M.A. degree in School Psychology. They then completed an additional 30 credits which was applied to a non-degree Specialist Certificate. The creation of the Ed.S. degree recognized these 30 credits as an independent degree program.

Historically, students who were accepted into the Ph.D. in Education with a specialization in School Psychology received their M.A. after completing the appropriate 30 hours of coursework and then used the additional 30 credits that were applied to the specialist certificate towards their Ph.D.

The purpose of this document is to request that students who are accepted into the Ph.D. in Education with a specialization in School Psychology be allowed to use the 60 credits of coursework that is required for the M.A. and Ed.S. in School Psychology towards their Ph.D. specialization requirements. The Ph.D. in Education requires 21 credits in an area of specialization. The requirements for the M.A. and Ed.S. in School Psychology far surpass this 21 credit requirement. These Ph.D. students who specialize in School Psychology are also required to complete another 21 credits of Ph.D. core coursework.

This proposed change does not alter the requirements for either the Ph.D. in Education or M.A./Ed.S. in School Psychology. It allows Ph.D. students to apply their specialization credits to both Ph.D. and M.A./Ed.S. degree programs.

If this change is approved, students completing an M.A., and Ed.S. in School Psychology and a Ph.D. in Education would complete a **minimum** of 90 credits (30 for MA, 30 for EdS, 21 for PhD core, and 9 for Dissertation credits).
