The goal of the Educational Studies Minor is to enable students across campus to engage deeply in educational issues within their particular professional interests. The proposed new course in the minor is EDUC 297 – Introduction to Psychology in Schools. This course would be one of three options for the Development of Students elective. The other two options for this elective would be EDUC 205 – Human Development: Grades K-8 and EDUC 413 – Adolescent Development and Educational Psychology.

By requiring students to take one of these three courses, they will be learning about important issues in the developmental needs of students. EDUC 205 and 413 are most relevant to those students interested in typical developmental processes, whereas EDUC 297 will be most relevant to those students interested in atypical development. Thus, the new course offers content not currently available in the minor. This course will have two main topic areas: 1) organization and operation of school-based mental health services, and 2) frequently encountered social-emotional and behavioral difficulties in school-aged youth and interventions to address these challenges.

Adding the new course EDUC 297 will ensure that the minor addresses several of the goals. In this course, students will think critically by analyzing service delivery models and making recommendations about how best to address the service needs of children and youth (Goal 2). Because our understanding of the prevention, development, course, and intervention of mental health challenges in children and youth is constantly evolving, the course lends itself to developing students' intellectual curiosity and engagement by considering new research (Goal 6). Finally, because decisions related to the treatment of children and youth frequently are not clear cut, and typically involve value judgments of those charged with children's care, the course will explore the ethical implications embedded in the treatment of minors in school settings (Goal 4).

Describe the rationale for the proposed program change(s):

We are proposing to expand the number of courses that address the development of students in the Educational Studies Minor from one to three. Students in the minor are currently required to take EDUC 205 – Human Development: Grades K-8, which focuses on typical developmental processes. However, students may be interested in taking a course that focuses on atypical developmental processes. Therefore, we would like to provide students with the option of taking the new course EDUC 297 – Introduction to Psychology in Schools because it covers atypical developmental processes.

We would create a new "Development of Students" category of electives where students could choose from EDUC 205, 297, and 413. EDUC 413 – Adolescent Development and Educational Psychology is a required course for most secondary education majors and focuses on typical developmental processes. We would like to include this course in the set of options because some students may want to learn about typical developmental processes at the secondary level instead of the elementary level (i.e., EDUC 205). However, we would restrict EDUC 413 to only students in secondary education majors because this course has a field experience in a classroom specific to the students' content area (e.g., a high school mathematics classroom for secondary education majors, the minor would enhance the secondary education students' background in education beyond what they learn in their major.
