Originally we allowed Certificate students to select a focus on either labor or environmental issues. However, according to our advisory board members, all students need some coursework in labor and environmental issues to support a broad understanding of sustainability. We developed a new configuration to allow students to take courses addressing both labor and environmental content. There are no new courses. We are maintaining the certificate at 9 credits, however, so that the certificate is portable to other universities graduate programs (typically 9 credits is the maximum that can be transferred from another school).
