Fred,

I can only answer for UGS0221 (minor in Environmental Sustainability). FREC 343 is a definite addition to the list of sustainability-related breadth courses. We would be hesitant to add FREC100 since all the other courses are at least 300-level to provide significant challenge in the minor. A 100-level course would not be consistent in this regard and could also lead to an imbalance in enrollment.
