- WHEREAS, the Delaware Governor's office commissioned task forces in 2008 and 2011 that documented an acute need for additional speech-language pathologists in the state, performed a cost-benefit analysis, and recommended that a master's program in speech-language pathology (required for licensure in all states) should be developed in the College of Health Sciences at the University of Delaware, and
- WHEREAS, the U.S. Bureau of Labor Statistics projects that employment of speechlanguage pathologists is expected to grow by 23 percent between 2010 and 2020, and
- WHEREAS, the Governor's office specifically wishes to know that the University has approved a curriculum for this program before committing the resources necessary to launch it, and
- WHEREAS, the College of Health Sciences has brought in several consultants who have gone through the process of establishing master's programs in speech-language pathology to provide expert advice for the development of the proposed curriculum and related budget, and
- WHEREAS, the College of Health Sciences will not launch the program in the absence of a commitment of full financial support from the state of Delaware necessary to support the first several years of operation until the program can reasonably become self-sustaining in accordance with budget projections, and
- WHEREAS, the proposed program will contribute to the University's "Path to Prominence": to become a premier research and graduate university; be it therefore
- RESOLVED, that the Faculty Senate recommends provisionally, for five years, the establishment of a new MA program in Speech-Language Pathology, effective September 1, 2016; and be it further
- RESOLVED, that this new program shall be launched provided only that full financial support for five years is received from the State of Delaware by June 30, 2014.
